Because of poor telephone service it was not until this morning that I was finally able to get through to Rigo in Colombia.

He was excited about the service last night because more than 143 people came to Christ. The counseling room was full to overflowing. There are 10 evangelical churches in this large area with an average membership of 50. You can imagine how excited the pastors of these 10 churches must be. They are all anticipating an even greater attendance and more decisions at tonight's service.

This morning Rigo held a seminar for 60 young people of the area.

This afternoon he will travel some distance over almost impassable dirt roads to begin another crusade at 4:00 in an area that is the center of the Colombian paramilitary. He then will rush back to Pivijay to preach that crusade service tonight at 7:30. Tomorrow, Sunday, he will repeat what he is doing today.

Today Rigo's voice sounded much better and he and I are hoping that he will be able to travel back to Santa Marta on Monday and have two days of much needed rest before he begins the next crusade in Rio Hacha.

Rigo and I are grateful that Roy González, a dear brother who lives in Panama, has been accompanying him on this trip. Roy loves the Lord and has two masters in music. Rigo said that last night Roy had to take over the crusades music service and as a result all were greatly blessed.

Please pray for safety and health for Rigo and Roy and pray that tonight's service and the services tomorrow will be used mightily of the Lord.

Grateful for your upholding Rigo, Roy, and these crusades in your prayers.
